



This heartwarming middle-grade historical fiction tells the story of 11-year-old Cora living in a rural Appalachian community in 1937 Kentucky. Cora is eager to be a journalist. When she learns that the electric cooperative is coming to her small mountain community if enough people sign up, she starts a school newspaper to convince everyone why electricity would be helpful. But her mother, still grieving the death of her daughter, is adamantly opposed to electricity and the possibility of losing their mountain way of life. Cora, and young readers, learn that it is important to consider opposing viewpoints to come to fair conclusions. The book also includes information on mountain herbalism, the Frontier Nursing Service, and the Pack Horse Library Project to create a well-rounded view of Appalachia in the 30s.

This Young Adult Historical Fiction follows a family striving to better their lives in Jackson, Mississippi under the harsh realities of Jim Crow. The narrative is told through several voices, including Lamb's mother who is a hard-working, creative seamstress who cannot reveal she is a lesbian, Lamb's brother who has a brilliant mind and has even earned a college scholarship but his impulsiveness and rebellious nature angers their mother who is terrified of losing her children, and Lamb herself who is a quiet and studious girl caught between family tensions. These three along with additional voices guide readers through a book that looks directly at the indescribable horrors of lynching, specifically of the Black women who were victims of lynching and are often forgotten. It is heartbreaking and difficult yet incredibly important and beautiful.




A FLAG FOR JUNETEENTH by Kim Taylor

This wonderful picture book tells the story of Huldah, a young girl living on a Texas plantation with her family, eager to celebrate her 10th birthday on June 19th, 1865. When the message is finally delivered that African Americans in Texas were free, Huldah and her close-knit community celebrate by creating a community freedom flag. Kim Taylor is a debut author and artist as well as an expert quilter and each of the illustrations is hand sewn and quilted, giving the book a homespun, tactile quality, and the story will help young readers connect to Juneteenth through Huldah to recognize it's importance and gravity.



The Virginia Library Association Cardinal Cup Award is presented to the most outstanding book for young people in the subject of history, biography, or historical fiction. Established in 1982 and presented since 1983, the Cardinal Cup Committee's goal is to promote reading about America's past; to encourage the quality writing of United States history, biography, and historical fiction for young people, and to recognize authors in these disciplines.

In 2024, the Cardinal Cup Committee selected their winner, honors, series of note, and overfloweth selections from 214 submissions. The Cardinal Cup Overfloweth list contains the books recommended by the 2024 Cardinal Cup Committee from publisher submissions. All books were published in 2023.
