WHY TEEN CARDS?

YOUTH CARD POLICY



- 30 physical items & e-resources
- Overdue, lost& damagedfees
- Parent
 signature &
 confirmation
 of address
 required

WHY TEEN CARDS?

BARRIER TO TEENS

PARENTS (THE ABSENCE OF)

- Parents aren't there to a sign for a card
 - » Teens are in the building independently
 - » School library card drives are inefficient and impractical
 - » A teen's library card could be blocked by parental late fees

WHY TEEN CARDS?

CONCERNS

FISCAL REQUIREMENTS

- No overdue fine forgiveness (City-level prerogative)
- Parent signature & address increases accountability when obtaining fees

ACCOUNTABILITY

- Need a motivator for teens to return items
- Since teens are more independent, there should be an expectation of responsible library use

TEEN CARD POLICY

(APPROVED ON THE 3RD TRY)

- 3 check outs (now 5)
- School ID as accepted ID
- No late fines
- Lost & damaged fees
- No additional users
- No parental signature*
- Parents can cancel a teen card (but not see it)

* We removed the parent signature by limiting fiscal responsibility



HOW DO WE GARNER SUPPORT?

- Using the familiar
- Anticipate major challenges and build solutions
- Third Alternatives (where possible)
- Research

- No late fines
- Lost & damaged fees


