FLASH FICTION WORKSHOP. Sat., Nov. 4, Meeting Room B, 10:30 AM.

Flash fiction is a short-short story, often 1,000 words or less, that can be read quickly but packs a powerful punch. Participants will learn how flash fiction works, then begin first drafts that might eventually be submitted. We will briefly discuss how to submit completed works. Participants may be interested in honing their drafts and bringing them back the following week for the Fiction Critique Session on Nov. 11.

BOOK2FILM CLASSIC: THE PRODUCERS. Nov. 4, Meeting Room B, 2 PM.

Join us for a screening of the classic 1968 comedy film starring Gene Wilder and directed by Mel Brooks. How does a play so utterly wrong, go so right? This satiric romp teaches perhaps the most essential lessons for writers of all time: how to stop taking one's work so seriously, laugh, and roll with it; and most of all, what to do when you face unexpected success!

MYSTERY WRITING WITH SISTERS IN CRIME. Mon., Nov. 13, Programming Room, 6 PM. Join Mystery by the Sea, the Hampton Roads Chapter of Sisters in

Crime, for their monthly meeting to learn more about the craft and business of writing mysteries and crime fiction! Network with fellow writers of all skill levels, from beginners to published novelists. The group has produced two successful anthologies in the *Virginia Is for Mysteries* series.

With later revisions by Austen, posthumous publication, and a 2016 film adaptation that draws upon both, writers have much to discuss about the vision and creative process of one of the most admired English novelists of all time!
