





VERA BUSHWACK BY SIG BURWASH

Vera Bushwack is the story of Drew who is building a cabin in the woods on their own in the wilderness of Nova Scotia. When Drew fires up their chainsaw they are transported into their alter-ego Vera Bushwack—a fearless renegade in assless chaps. Astride their noble steed, nothing is impossible for Vera to overcome. Through this alter-ego Drew explores past trauma, joy, anger, and grief as they ride toward self-acceptance in a world full of men who would love to tell them what to do. Sig Burwash uses pencil drawings and a limited color palette to share this imaginative tale of resilience.




VICTORY PARADE by Leela Corman

Theme: PTSD, Feminism, Nationality, Immigration, Religion

Victory Parade, written and illustrated by Leela Corman, explores the brutal realities of World War II at the home front in Brooklyn and the liberation of Buchenwald concentration camp. The stories told include Rose-a welder in the Brooklyn Navy Yard, Ruth-a German Jewish refugee who becomes a wrestler, and Sam-a war veteran having flashbacks to the horrific experience of liberating Buchenwald. Using grotesque hand drawn and watercolor illustrations with a nonlinear narrative, Corman wrenches readers into the harsh and unpredictable reality of the human experience.




FIREBUGS by Nino Bulling

Theme: LGBTQIA+, Mental health

Firebugs is a meditative exploration of a year spent in early gender transition in the queer European party scene. As Ingken's days blur into their nights and global crises fill the headlines, they become more disconnected from the world around them. A palpable sensation of dysphoria rises from the minimalist illustrations, opening the reader's eyes to the experience of loss and dissociation felt by many in the transgender community when they first realize who they truly are. Bulling's airy dialogue and limited color palette infuse the work with the aching detachment, yet keeps thread of hope alive as Ingken takes the first steps into becoming who they were always meant to be.



GOOD: FROM THE AMAZON JUNGLE TO SUBURBIA AND BACK by FLuX

The personal account of David Good, the son of an indigenous Yanomami woman and an American anthropologist. FLuX weaves a narrative between the black and white images of David's upbringing in a primarily white community and the vivid colors of his mother's recollections of her lost home. This juxtaposition, along with the fascinating story, draw the reader in and cheering for David as he struggles to understand the dichotomy of his life.

HUNGRY HEART (VOL 1) by Jem Milton




